


2024 COMPLIANCE REPORT









SCHOOL FEATURES

St Dominic's Priory College is a Catholic girls Reception to Year 12 school of 663 students. The College strongly reflects the composition of the Australian multi-cultural community. Refugees from many parts of the world are welcomed, as are International Students.

The College is located five minutes north of the city centre in a quiet corner of North Adelaide. Founded in 1884 by Dominican Sisters from England, it has in common with Dominican Schools around the world, a long tradition of teaching and learning. At the request of the Dominican Sisters of North Adelaide, the Dominican Sisters of Eastern Australia and the Holy Cross Congregation of Dominican Sisters, Dominican Education Australia was formally inaugurated in August 2016 and now has oversight of the Ministries that were previously the responsibility of the three congregations. They are: Siena College (Melbourne), Santa Sabina College and St Lucy's School (Sydney) and Cabra Dominican College, St Mary's College and St Dominic's Priory College (Adelaide).

The Dominican motto of 'Truth, and the pursuit of truth wherever it is found' is seen as essential to its philosophy of learning. Acting on that truth in outreach to the neighbour is the desired outcome of this pursuit. The opportunity to nurture character and confidence is enhanced by the school's moderate size. Education at St Dominic's is based on a deep respect for the unique qualities and gifts of each child.

The College has an outstanding reputation in South Australia for the quality of its students' educational achievements across a broad range of learning areas. St Dominic's is committed to providing a balanced education where physical, intellectual and emotional growth are seen as complementary. Joy and enthusiasm are valued in the school's daily life and a wide range of co-curricula activities foster these goals.

The report presented here is a requirement of the Commonwealth Government as outlined in the *Schools Assistance Act 2008*. St Dominic's reports this data with pride in the significant achievements of staff and students.

It is presented under three headings: Professional Engagement, Student Learning Outcomes and Satisfaction.

We acknowledge St Dominic's Priory College is situated on Kaurna Land and we pay our respects to Elders past, present and future.



STUDENT COHORT

ENROLMENTS

A total of 663 students were enrolled at St Dominic's Priory College, with five (5) International Students and three (3) students who identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, included in this cohort. Furthermore, there were 112 students who received support for a disability as identified under the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD). Year level enrolments for 2024 as per the August census are reflected in the table below.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

St Dominic's Priory College maintains a high level of student attendance. In 2024, the average student attendance rate was 92.8%.

The College provides multiple channels by which student absences can be notified. When a student is absent without explanation, a SMS text message is sent to the Parent or Guardian seeking clarification of the reasons for the absence as well as a follow up phone call when necessary. If needed, a letter is forwarded to families to clarify any unresolved absences. In addition, absences are monitored by Year Level Coordinators and the Deputy Principal, who work in partnership with parents/guardians to maximise the wellbeing of students.

The percentage figure for the average student attendance rate, as detailed below, shows the proportion of days that each student, on average, attends schol throughout the year. The larger the percentage, the smaller the number of days that students are absent from school.






FINANCE

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

SENIOR SECONDARY OUTCOMES

St Dominic's Year 12 students of 2024 achieved overall outstanding results. Twenty-nine percent (29%) of the Year 12 class achieved an ATAR score of 90 and above (top 10% in the State). Fourteen percent (14%) achieved a score of 95 and above (top 5% in the State).

Overall, over 89% of all passes were of A and B grade standard.

Seventeen (17) Merits were obtained across the following twelve (12) subjects: Activating Identities & Futures, Biology, Chemistry, Drama, English, English Literary Studies, Essential English, General Mathematics, Legal Studies, Society & Culture, Vietnamese, Workplace Practices.

Thirty-seven (37) Senior School students were awarded a VET Qualification.

The full range of subject achievements for 2024 were published in Issue 1 of the 2025 College Newsletter. We extend our congratulations to all Year 12 students of 2024.



TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

The academic qualifications of our teaching staff is shown in the pie chart below:



In addition to formal qualifications, all staff undergo training in mandatory Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect - Education and Care (RRHAN), and First Aid Care for an Educational Setting. Teaching staff hold the required qualifications for Teacher Registration in South Australia, and are trained in the Child Protection Curriculum. A wide range of Professional Development Opportunities are made available throughout the year.

STUDENT SATISFACTION

STUDENT SURVEY

Research indicates a strong positive correlation between student satisfaction and a school's operations. Exiting students' perceptions of school climate are important in understanding ways to improve school quality and satisfaction among students and teachers for future years.

A positive school environment empowers members of the school community to contribute to the ongoing improvement of the school and eliminate negative behaviours. The Exiting Student Survey is designed to provide schools with data useful for fostering a positive learning and working environment that promotes academic success among all students. Initial assessment provides a baseline, and ongoing assessment helps to determine whether programs are effective at improving the school climate, and whether they continue to be relevant for schools over time.

Performance of students is frequently reviewed; however, this only offers a snapshot and can often overlook the range of experiences, values and qualities that make up a school.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The exiting students at St Dominic's Priory College expressed an overall satisfaction rate of 81%, surpassing the benchmark for Catholic Girls' Schools by 4%. Furthermore, compared to the 2023 results, the 2024 results indicate a 2% increase in satisfaction levels. The percentage figures below represent mean scores for individual items. Students displayed the highest levels of satisfaction with Student Behavioural Values, and the lowest with Technology and Resources.

PARENT SATISFACTION

Parents at St Dominic's Priory College showed an overall mean satisfaction level of 81%. Compared with the Catholic Girls' Schools benchmark, satisfaction levels for St Dominic's parents were 4% higher. Percentage figures below indicate mean scores for each item.

Parents at St Dominic's displayed the highest levels of satisfaction with the key area of *School Environment*, and the lowest levels with the key area of *School Curriculum*.


