

On Tuesday 2nd April, the Year 9 cohort visited the Migration Museum as part of our English poetry unit. Throughout the day, we engaged in many different activities such as listening to speakers tell their migration stories, investigating migrant suitcases and taking a tour of the museum.



One of the highlights was listening to curator, Andrew Hill, who spoke about his exhibition, *In Our Own Voices*, which focuses on portraits and stories of resettlement from the Middle East to Australia. From this we were able to learn about the realities of migration and reflect on these experiences in the form of poetry.

We were inspired by the various resources, viewed, read and heard and are now in the process of writing our own poems. We hope to provide a service to the community by donating our poetry to the museum, so that migrant stories are preserved.
