

Dear Parents,

Last Sunday's Sports Day was a great credit to our students who participated so strongly throughout the day. It was a credit to Staff and Parent helpers who so generously gave their time to ensure that everything ran smoothly. We congratulate Aquinas Gold on taking out the Guerin Shield for the highest points achieved on the day. All the results are printed in today's Bulletin and, as you know there are major achievements in every House. Well done to all!

Re the Year 12 Centre. Printed below are extracts from one of the speeches given on the day of the Opening and Blessing on Friday 15 March 2019. As most of the community could not be there I hope it will put you in touch with some of the thoughts expressed.

Your Excellency the Honourable Hieu Van Le, and Mrs Le, thank you for honouring us with your presence today. Welcome to all here, each one of you a special guest.

When the founding group of Sisters signed off on the certificate of title for the original purchase of town acre 846 in Molesworth Street, they could never have imagined just what a contested place North Adelaide would have become 100 years later that it would, in 2019, be an historic achievement for an institution to migrate from one side of Hill Street at 77, to the other side at 74. Joining us here today is a member of the family who lived his childhood at 74 Hill Street. Several members of his family attended St. Dominic's. We extend a warm welcome to Dr. Robert Britten Jones.

This day, which we share to mark the opening of our Year 12 centre, is the story of people with a vision. It highlights the way in which the, "art of the possible" has always worked from the very beginning for the community of St. Dominic's Priory College; a vibrant community of Dominican Sisters, Staff, Parents and Students without significant assets, on a restricted campus, but with the vision to seize on possibilities. The story is focussed on the most legitimate cause in the world that of the rights of children and youth to a safe environment, and their right to the finest education we can provide.

As each building development plan took shape in the 70s, 80s and the 90s and into the new millennium, we came to expect that there would be a struggle to get permission to provide educational facilities. We had settled in a corner of North Adelaide labelled very much later, residential only, and with a growing opposition to institutional development.

Opening this Centre today is probably all the more satisfying because it also has been a hard won achievement. It is important to acknowledge that without the insight of David Hutchison from Access Planning re the Planning Act and the significance of Section 49, plus the valuable input determination of our Board of Directors under the leadership of our chair Mr Jim Howard, Business Manager and College Leadership team, we may not be sitting here in this beautiful space. We were helped also by Government Ministers and department personnel. While we were hopeful of a good outcome, the person with the authority to sign a final approvals was also key to it. We are deeply indebted to the intervention which saw the approval arrive on February 15 2018, signed, John Rau Minister for Planning.

Kon Michael Architect from Swanbury Penglase was one of those who expressed an interest in designing the centre at 74 Hill Street. We have from the time of his coming on board in 2016 been confident in, and excited by his vision and skill and his desire to find the best solution for this educational facility. He has produced the design of this Centre as the first stage of our Master Plan. I'm sure you would agree that his work speaks for itself eloquently.

Builders Mossop Constructions and Interiors have certainly earned our respect and appreciation at every stage.

As a long serving Principal I am but one privileged among the committed groups represented here today. Together we are strongly motivated to give our very fine St. Dominic's students the best opportunities we can to achieve their goals now, and into the future. Thank you all for your most valued contribution to this community.

What I enjoyed most: the pool party, the 5 metre pool, the waterslide, jumping in the deep pool, swimming in the deep water, saving other people, jumping in without our goggles.

What I found challenging: going slow, doing side stroke, learning all the different strokes, trying not to be scared of the deep water.

I was proud of the way: I danced in the water, of my level of ability, to do all the strokes, trying my hardest.

The swimming skills I learnt or improved: survival swimming, side stroke, survival backstroke, backstroke.

The most important rules I learnt about water safety: never swim alone, don't go too deep if there is no life saver, never swim against a rip, swim between the flags.

I used my growth mindset: to keep pushing down to the bottom of the pool, walking back to school afterwards, I focused on what the instructor was saying, when I jumped in the deep pool I didn't freak out, when it was deep I didn't catastrophise.

Our overall summary of this experience is: I had fun, the instructors were helpful, it was scary but great, it was exciting, we want to do it next year, I learnt lots.
