
The St Dominic's Priory College Hall houses many significant gatherings on any day of the week.




Year 11 Retreat

On Tuesday of week 5, George Evatt, a multi award-winning cinematographer who has worked with David Attenborough, spread awareness to the Year 11 Geography Class and Year 10's on the importance of reducing the use of single use plastics for the future of our oceans. The effects climate change has on ocean acidification and the survivability of sea creatures and plants was presented through footage of the world's oceans and Australia's unique sea creatures. Additionally, statistics were presented to put the global issue in reality, estimating that in one year in Sydney alone, 1 billion disposable coffee cups are used! These cups, along with straws, plastic bags and bottles are the most used single use plastics and we must do our part to use them less.
