Oz Kids in Print May 2018

Congratulations must go to ten St Dominic's students who had their poetry and short stories published in the recent edition of the national magazine, *Oz Kids in Print*. The poem, 'Ballerina' by Year 9 student, Sophie Ngo, as well as the Year 12 poems, 'My Place' by Emelia Haskey and Claire Hennessy's 'Home on High', were all written in the Creative Writing Club.




The other successful students were Year 12s who wrote original, engaging narratives as part of their English course. Madelyn Totsikas produced a powerful story about the modelling world called 'Battery Hens', and Anna Nguyen's 'Home' is a moving account about children who escape the Vietnam War. 'Black Swan' by Amy Pham centres on a perfect prima ballerina and 'Angel Wings' is Bridie Doyle's heart wrenching tale of loss. Rachel Nguon's 'Bon Chole Chnam Thmey' (Khmer New Year) is a harrowing story of the genocide in Cambodia, while Lily Bentley's, 'Cold Coffee' celebrates the joy of AFL football and the poignancy of a broken father/son relationship. In 'Hunter's Deer', Cindy Cao uses a metaphorical title to describe the emotional turmoil of a gymnast's performance. It is also important to note that Emelia Haskey and Claire Hennessy not only had their poems published, but their narratives as well with 'When I Write' and 'Seeing in the Dark', a great achievement.

**Thus, the St Dom's girls dominated this issue and it is a record number of entries from a single school published in one edition. Indeed, this is a testament to the talent of our students! Well done, girls!**
