Visit to Migration Museum

On Wednesday the 14th of March the Year 5 Class merrily strutted in a bubble of joy to the Adelaide Migration Museum. Once we arrived we met with our guides Madelina and Toby who separated us into

groups and took us on a journey through time. Firstly our group focused on the "Golden Thread of Time" which was a long yellow rope with little key tags that were engraved with dates and events that happened in Australia's and the world's history. This gave us a visual representation of how long people had been in Australia for and had some interesting key events for us to focus on.



Once finished, we gracefully walked into the old part of the museum and learnt about the tools used to create parts of Adelaide city such as an axe to clear trees, a chain for measuring distance and a compass for direction.

Toby was our next guide, he was very enthusiastic and had a great sense of humour. Toby taught us about the maps of the world and specifically about the indigenous constellations associated with the indigenous language groups of certain parts of Australia.

We finished our session by looking at heritage surveying equipment that would have been used to map parts of Adelaide city. On our walk back we were able to stop for lunch in a park and enjoy the beautiful weather before returning to school. We had a great time and learnt a lot about Australia's vast history.
