Dear Parents,

#### Dominic de Guzman:

"Loved and Honoured, leading us to Greater Faith"

In early August we celebrate with thanksgiving the life of our founder St. Dominic de Guzman, born in Caluerega, Northern Spain, in 1170. #### Have you read this book to your child? The Waterhole

Graeme Base has written and illustrated a range of books for primary children. One of my favourites is The Waterhole. On the surface, it seems like a simple counting book, useful for reading to younger children which counts a number of animals coming to drink at the waterhole. With young children, there is lots of opportunity for discussion about the different animals and their appearances.

The beauty of this book is the different layers which older children can access. Firstly, there are hidden animals in the illustrations. These animals are endangered or extinct. Each page covers a different continent or climate zone and this can be a good place to build an understanding of world geography.
