### North Adelaide Large Institutions and Colleges DPA

The Development Plan Amendments to the City of Adelaide Plan were gazetted today. They are introduced as supporting "the future of 11 sites across North Adelaide" which in turn support the health and education sector. The Institutions named are: *Helping Hand Aged Care, St. Dominic's Priory College, Calvary Hospital, St. Ann's College, Kathleen Lumley College, Women's and Children's Hospital, Memorial Hospital, St. Mark's College and Aquinas College*. The amendments allow for development to occur outside our current boundaries. This is of critical importance to the future development of our school. The amendments will have strong opposition from some members of Council who are opposed to these community services having the right, in justice, to develop beyond their boundaries. **A**s we know schools are very busy places. We always endeavour to provide a rich learning environment with opportunities for students to shine and be encouraged to take on new challenges. 
As we commemorate these significant milestones, all classes will acknowledge these events and be actively involved through research, viewing, buddy groups, prayer, poster design and discussion.

## 2017 CAT Competition Results

The Computational and Algorithmic Thinking Competition was held at school on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> March and involved 143 students from Year 6 to Year 12. Students had one hour to answer nine multiple choice questions involving logical thinking.

All participating students have received certificates according to their level of achievement. Three Distinction and 33 Credit certificates were awarded to St Dominic's students. The students achieving Distinctions were *Carolyn Nguyen* (8G), *Katelyn Nguyen* (8B) and *Olivia Wilson* (8G). Well done, Year 8s! These three students are commended for their outstanding results and will be presented with their certificates at the end of semester assembly.

We congratulate all students who participated in this very challenging competition and who prepared themselves by practising their skills using competition papers from previous years.

We encourage students from all year levels to enter our second and final competition for the year: the **Australian Maths Competition** (AMC). This will be held at school in Term 3 on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> July. Maths Club (held after school on Wednesdays) is available for competition preparation and practice, where students can discuss their mathematical thinking with others in small collaborative groups and get help from teachers and Year 12 helpers.

### Tim Silverwood Presentation – No Time to Waste

We were urged to take part in an initiative he started in 2009, 'Take 3 for the Sea'. In this movement, we are encouraged to take three pieces of rubbish when we go to the beach. It's a simple action that can have an important impact on marine wildlife.

We were truly inspired by what Tim Silverwood had to say, and with newfound awareness will participate in the fight against waste.

### Analytical Chemistry Workshop @ Flinders University



## Year 12 Geography

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of May, the Year 12 Geography students visited many locations around Adelaide to investigate possible topics for our **Individual Field Studies**, which will be completed during Terms 2 and 3.



We began by visiting **Christie Walk**, a sustainable housing project in Sturt St. This project gave us many ideas for investigating how sustainable community living can exist in the inner city. They have used a variety of sustainable and recycled materials to build their houses and created a lush, green environment through the many plants and trees incorporated into the area. We then visited the suburbs of Bowden and Brompton to learn about the effects of medium density housing in Adelaide.

At **St Claire** and **New Port Quays**, we were able to see two urban redevelopment projects. After a relaxing lunch at **Glenelg**, we visited the **West Beach Boat Harbour** where we were introduced to the many methods of field work we could complete on and around the beach.

The day was informative and enabled us to find an area of interest for our field studies. We thank Mr Mau for driving the bus and Mrs Shepherd for teaching us about the many developments happening around our city.
